FY 2018 Applications and Plans

- A total of 61 Tribes and Tribal Organizations
- All applications & plans were accepted.

 28 were two-year plans - 15 will need NEW applications in FY 2019

- 3rd Continuing Resolution allocation of CSBG funds to Tribes, February 7, 2018

- 4th Continuing Resolution allocation of CSBG funds to Tribes, February 9, 2018
 - o Funding for February 9, 2018 March 23, 2018





The Federal Financial Report (SF-425): Helpful Hints

- Report Type
- CSBG funds are <u>available</u> for obligation during the awarded fiscal year and the succeeding fiscal year.
- All obligations for the grant award must be <u>obligated</u> by or before September 30th of the funding period.
- All grant awards must be expended 90 days after the end of the grant funding award period.
- Any funds that have not been expended by the December 30th date must be returned to the federal government.


