OPIOID CRISIS RESOURCES FOR TRIBAL POPULATIONS

Past Year Opioid Misuse
In the past year, 11.8 million people in the U.S. aged 12 and older misused opioids and 948,000 reported using heroin¹. Within this number, 63,000 American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN) aged 12 and older reported misusing opioids and 5,000 aged 12 and older reported using heroin. Federal agencies within the Department of Health and Human Services including the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) continue to provide information, resources, and toolkits to support recovery from opioid misuse. This document was compiled specifically for tribal communities and funding opportunities for tribal communities who may face substance use problems at rates above the overall population.

First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act Cooperative Agreement
The First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FR-CARA) Cooperative Agreements program award funds to states.

Strategic Prevention Framework for Prescription Drugs (SPF-Rx)
The SPF Rx grant program provides an opportunity for states, U.S. territories, and tribal jurisdictions (herein referred to as "states"), completed a Strategic Prevention Grant (SPG SIG) to target the priority. The program is designed to reduce the dangers of sharing medications and medical communities on the risks adults. SPF Rx will also raise community awareness of prescription drug abuse prevention activities communities, parents, prescribers, and

Grants for Tribal Behavioral Health
The Tribal Behavioral Health (TBH) program is designed to support Tribal Behavioral Health (Short SAMHSA supports efforts that promote a young people up to and including reducing suicidal behavior, substance use, and

Grant for Children and Adolescents
This grant is to provide funding to states/territories/evidence based substance use disorder prevention and/or transitional aged youth with substance use and mental disorders.

Opioid Prescribing
The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is committed to preventing opioid overdose deaths by improving the quality and timeliness of data, strengthening state efforts by scaling up effective interventions, and improving patient safety by equipping health care providers with the data and tools needed to improve opioid prescribing.

Tribal Action Plans (TAPs)
In response to the Tribal Law and Order Act, tribes are encouraged to develop a TAP which is designed to coordinate resources and programs to help prevent and treat substance use disorders in tribal communities. Tribes develop their own TAP based on the substance use issues in their community.

Naloxone
Naloxone is an "opioid antagonist"—a prescription drug that can temporarily reverse opioid overdose and save lives. HHS created several tools to assist with training first responders to administer naloxone safely and efficiently, and to increase access to naloxone devices by facilitating development of local partnerships.

Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs (PDMPs)
PDMPs are state-run databases that collect data on controlled substances distributed in a state. Information from PDMPs is used to identify and deter prescription drug abuse and diversion. For information about PDMPs see the following link

Deadlines for Obligating & Spending CSBG Funds

- CSBG funds are distributed on an annual fiscal year basis.
- Funds distributed for a fiscal year are available for obligation during that fiscal year and the succeeding fiscal year.
- Funds that were issued in FY2018 must be **obligated** by September 30, 2019 and **expended** by December 30, 2019.
